Swarm season has begun. There is a "Swarm Removal" list of beekeepers on the website that can assist you or your neighbors. Some charge and some don't. Check your hives and stay ahead of them. If they grow quickly, add another box. If you have drawn comb, consider pulling a couple frames from the brood chamber, move them to the upper box and replace them with empty frames. If you want to do a split now...out of state queens are available at this time. Local queens will be several weeks out due to the rainy weather.

Check your overwintered hives for mite counts.
